Professor Takashi Inoguchi has a MA from University of Tokyo, Ph.D. from Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He is currently President, University of Niigata Prefecture, and Professor Emeritus, the University of Tokyo. He is specializes in political science, International relations and Japanese politics, editor-in chief, Asian Journal of Comparative Politics(SAGE Publications) and the director of "AsiaBarometer" survey. On top of publications of 150 books in Japanese and in English, his latest publication is 'The Quality of Life in Asia: A Comparison of Quality of Life in Asia'.

Dr. Makio Miyagawa successively held positions in Ministry of Foreign Affairs; Chief of the Legal Desk, the Deputy Director of US-Japan Trade Division and of Russian Division, Director in Economic Affairs Bureau and Asia Oceania Bureau, Deputy Director-General of Climate Change Negotiations, Director-General of Nuclear Non-Proliferation and Disarmament Department, and Director-General of Middle East and North Africa Bureau. He served in the Japanese Embassy in the UK and in Malaysia, and also in the Japanese Mission in Geneva. He received his Doctor of Philosophy in International Relations from Oxford University, together with his Bachelor of Science, Aeronautical and Spacecraft Engineering from Tokyo University. He lectured international relations and international law as a visiting professor at the National Graduate Institute for Policy studies and at the University of Tokyo, while assigned as Director of the Japan Institute of

KAZUO OGURA Born 1938 in Tokyo. After graduating with degrees in law and economics from the University of Tokyo and Cambridge University, he began to work for the Japanese foreign service in 1962. After heading the Cultural Exchange Department and the Economic Affairs Bureau, he went on to serve as ambassador to Vietnam, Korea, and France before retiring in 2002. From 2003 to 2011, he was for 8 years president and now a senior advisor of the Japan Foundation. He currently leads a study group on the Paralympics at the Nippon Foundation and works for the Aoyama Gakuin University as invited professor.
