# ○授業の到達目標及びテーマ

The aim of this course is to provide students with a broad range of knowledge on concepts, theories, and issues in international development. Upon completion of this course, students should be able to 1) explain major concepts, theories and issues in international development, 2) conduct policy analysis of major development issues faced by developing countries, and 3) further develop their own research foundation for issues in international development policy.

# ○授業の概要

The course is prepared for students who have acquired reasonable understanding of international development and would like to further study theories and issues on international development with focus on policies by reviewing and discussing the leading literature.

## ○授業の方法

This course will be conducted in seminar style. In each session, assigned students are asked to present summary and their comments on the readings while other students are asked to submit their summary and comments on the readings in writing at the beginning of the session. After their presentation, we will have discussion. All students are expected to review additional literature related to the topic before each session to be able to actively participate in class discussions.
